"I saw that none could share the "refreshing" unless they obtain the victory over every besetment, over pride, selfishness, love of the world, and over every wrong word and action. We should, therefore, be drawing nearer and nearer to the Lord and be earnestly seeking that preparation necessary to enable us to stand in the battle in the day of the Lord. Let all remember that God is holy, and none but holy beings can ever dwell in His presence.⁵

"But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, he shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you." John 14:26

"...when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth ... " John 16:13

"When Jesus was gathering the dozen men about Him through whom He would found the Christian church, He did not seek them in venerable schools of the rabbis, or in the exclusive circle of the Sanhedrin. He did not send
