"Listen Closely" Part I

Musicians having a desire to teach professionally are required to study a very concentrated core curriculum of musical performance skills and pedagogies to earn their BS degree in Music Education.

They are required to be proficient on their major instrument, which includes private lessons, and several semesters of ensemble playing, recitals, and performance juries. They must also be proficient on all the instruments which make up the musical families. i.e., strings, woodwinds, brass, and percussion, as well as piano and voice.

Music theory which is also required includes, but is not limited to, the study of musical form and analysis, vocal, and/or instrumental conducting, arranging, sight singing, eartraining which requires musical dictation etc.

A little history

I remember several years ago what one of my first ear-training instructors said very emphatically about taking music dictation. <u>Listen very carefully before responding</u> to what you hear being played on the piano, <u>then</u> <u>write it down</u>.

She would play various chord progressions with a bass line and the class would have to write down the chords in 4-part choral style using the correct voicing/inversion of the chords that she played. **Listening closely was very important!**

"Rightfully Dividing the Word of Truth"

Careful/prayerful listening is a matter of eternal life or death when spiritually discerning what God's Word is saying to His people. It is very crucial, and one of the most essential gifts that characterize His last-day remnant people.
