<u>God</u> in an era of global apostasy" ¹ Rev. 13:8-14:15, {Emphasis supplied}.

"The beneficent Creator, after six days of Creation, rested on the seventh day <u>and</u> <u>instituted the Sabbath for all people</u> as a <u>memorial of Creation</u>.

The Sabbath is God's perpetual sign of His eternal covenant between Him and His people. Joyful observance of this holy time from evening to evening, sunset to sunset, is a celebration of
