However, being cheap with our time concerning the salvation of souls is not fine!

What does this mean for us?



Not only are God's "remnant people," ¹ but all people are engaged in a spiritual war. ² The Lord is soon to come and many souls "without the fold" are *floundering in the valley of decision*.

TPT is not speaking of Joel's prophecy of the "valley of decision," or the imminent judgement of the wicked by God in his day, {see Joel 3:1-14} which is a different context altogether. TPT is stressing an important principle regarding indecision.

In a conventional war there are only two sides with many allies. In a spiritual war the same is true. All the inhabitants of the world must choose sides. This is where God's people need to come to the forefront!

We are "Biblically Commissioned" ³ to throw out the lifeline of Salvation to those who don't know Jesus! We are also admonished to call those who have become inebriated with the "wine of Babylon," out of spiritual confusion into the "Shepherd's Fold." ⁴

The Great Controversy between God and Satan, good and evil, is raging and rapidly

8. The Great Controversy
